

Activity: Issues with Lecture Capture

Purpose: To provide an opportunity for lecturers to discuss common lecture capture issues with the staff developer.

Context: Tutors probably have not begun using LC, but have heard about it or are planning to use it for their next module.

Issues included in the PPT:

- Attendance
- Student Privacy
- Quality Assurance
- Copyright and IPR
- Re-use and Re-purpose
- Pedagogy

Some of these issues may have already come up during earlier points in a workshop or after viewing demos.

It is useful for participants to be aware of each issue, although some groups may only need to focus on particular items. Often lecturers may not realize that something would be an issue until it is brought to their attention, or they encounter it in practice when it may be too late to deal with effectively.

The associated questions are meant to "unpack" each issue and to help lecturers approach the issue in a way which would apply to their own teaching.

Facilitator Notes

This activity tends to be very discussion-based. Participants are usually very keen to explore the issues and problems they perceive with LC, especially where those may intersect with their own practice. The staff developer running the workshop is not expected to have all the answers but should be knowledgeable enough to productively facilitate a discussion about the impact the technology may have on different teaching scenarios.

The accompanying PPT is intended to provide structure and focus to a discussion of the issues- the workshop facilitator may find it or its format useful. The PPT is licensed as BY-NC-SA (like most ELTAC documents) and can be used or modified freely so long as attribution is given.

Several of the issues (such as attendance and copyright) are documented more fully in other ELTAC documents on this site.
